AN ORDINANCE

TO AMEND CHAPTER 151, KNOWS AS 'FEES', OF ORDINANCE NO. 1646, CHANGING, DELETING, AND/OR ADDING CERTAIN FEES AND/OR LANGUAGE FOR CITY SERVICES IN VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Greensburg to amend Chapter 151 of Ordinance No. 1646 as follows:

A. Building permit fees. Building permit fees for, including, without limitation, commercial and residential (new construction and additions, repairs and alterations) buildings, utility and miscellaneous use groups [decks, towers, retaining walls (four feet or higher), commercial fences (over six feet in height)] construction, manufactured homes, and commercial swimming pools, shall include a \$150 application fee plus the cost of all third-party review fees. Building permit fees for residential swimming pools and residential fences (over 6 1/2 feet in height) shall include a \$75 application fee plus the cost of all third-party review fees. Extraordinary costs. When, in the course of enforcing or complying with the provisions of Chapter 265 of this Code, entitled "Zoning," any costs that are incurred by the City for inspection or testing beyond that normally anticipated and reasonable as indicated in § 265-190C, the applicant shall be invoiced for the same and shall render said amount within 30 days.

§ 151-12 **Opening fee.**

The fee for a street opening shall be \$500.

Article X **Volunteer Fire Department**

[Adopted 5-11-2020 by Ord. No. 2108]

§ 151-13 Findings and intent.

- A. Findings. The City of Greensburg recognizes that the duties of the Greensburg Volunteer Fire Department require the use of emergency rescue and response materials, hazardous abatement materials and fire-suppression tools, materials and equipment during its emergency responses. The City of Greensburg also recognizes that the costs of damaged or expended materials places an increasing financial burden on the Volunteer Fire Department.
- B. Intent. This article is intended to confirm and/or grant the Volunteer Fire Department the authority to seek recovery of all reasonable costs of responding to such emergency incidents, as allowed by applicable law.

§ 151-14 Authorization to recover costs.

The Greensburg Volunteer Fire Department is authorized to recover costs from property owners and/or insurance carriers for the usual, reasonable, and customary costs of abatement, construction, stabilization and any other materials used, consumed and /or expended in response to any fire, safety, rescue, hazardous waste or emergency incident.

§ 151-15 Emergency services not to be refused for lack of insurance or ability to pay.

Nothing in this article shall authorize the Volunteer Fire Department or Department personnel to refuse or delay any rescue service to any person, firm, organization or corporation, due to the lack of insurance coverage or inability or refusal to pay for said rescue services.

§ 151-16 Severability

If any part of this article is declared to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the validity of the remaining

provisions shall be unaffected thereby. It is the intention of the Council of the City of Greensburg that this article would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid part not been included.

§ 151-17 Repealer

All ordinances inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.
