## CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES Monday, October 12, 2015 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Silvis called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. City Administrator, Susan Trout, took roll call with the following members present: Councilman Vesely, Councilman Eger, Councilman Finfrock and Mayor Silvis. City Solicitor, Bernard McArdle, and City Treasurer/Fiscal Director, Mary Perez, were also present. Councilwoman McCormick was absent.

### \*\*\*PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE\*\*\*Councilman Vesely

\*\*\*BIDS\*\*\*Purchase of Turf Management Products. Ms. Trout, "Bids were accepted until October 8<sup>th</sup> for the purchase of turf management products for Mt. Odin Golf Course. After reviewing the bids, the Fiscal Director, the Golf Course Superintendent, and I recommend you vote to accept the low bid from Keystone Turf Products in the amount of \$37,565.60. There were two other bidders. We believe the low bidder met all the requirements that were requested; Keystone Turf Products from Export, PA, a local company, so we recommend you approve it."

- \*\*\*COMMENTS/BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR\*\*\*For the record, no one approached the podium to offer any comments/business from the floor.
- \*\*\*APPROVAL OF LAST MONTH'S COUNCIL MINUTES\*\*\*Councilman Vesely MOVED to approve the minutes from last month's Council Meeting, and Councilman Finfrock SECONDED. No discussion. Unanimously all voted in favor.
- \*\*\*APPROVAL OF MONTHLY BILL LIST\*\*\*Councilman Finfrock MOVED to approve the monthly bill list and pay the bills as the money becomes available, and Councilman Vesely SECONDED. No discussion. Unanimously all voted in favor.
- \*\*\*PRESENTATION\*\*\*At this time Mayor Silvis displayed a photograph taken of the Greensburg Volunteer Fire Department's trucks and apparatus presented to the City from Fire Chief J. Edward Hutchinson. Mayor Silvis continued, "I'm not going to total up how much it cost but there is a lot of equipment there and thank God we have it. We have a superior Fire Department and they really do a tremendous job."

#### \*\*\*REPORTS OF COUNCIL\*\*\*

Councilman Eger, "Good evening. The Recreation Department is accepting applications to participate in the annual Holiday Parade. They will be accepted until November 2<sup>nd</sup>. Forms are available on the City's website at <a href="www.greensburgpa.org">www.greensburgpa.org</a> or by calling the Recreation Office at 724-834-4880. The second season of our Ice Skating Institute (ISI) skating programs will begin

Thursday, November 12<sup>th</sup>. We are taking registrations at this time. Also, our Sunday afternoon public ice skating session will begin on November 1<sup>st</sup>. It is from 2:00-4:00 p.m. This is our best session to come and skate as a family. That concludes my report."

Councilwoman McCormick, reported by Councilman Finfrock-See attached Department of Public Works Report.

Councilman Vesely-See attached Planning and Development Department Report.

Councilman Finfrock-See attached Fiscal Department Report. Councilman Finfrock continued, "Keep in mind though that 79% is 4% higher than 75% which is where we are through the year and we're three quarters of the way through the year. While we're not doing as well percentage-wise as we were last year, we're still doing sort of okay. Expenses are really good. And, again, 63% is much less than 75% which is where you should be. So we're very thankful to our employees for doing a good job and that concludes the report on finances."

### \*\*\*MAYOR'S REPORT\*\*\*

- a. Code, Fire and Police Reports. Mayor Silvis reviewed the Code, Fire and Police Reports. Copies of these reports may be obtained at the respective offices or the City Administration Office.
- b. The Westmoreland Museum of American Art (WMAA) Grand Opening Celebration. Ms. Trout, "The WMAA is having their Grand Opening over the weekend of October 24-25. A free Community Day is planned for Sunday, October 25<sup>th</sup>, from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. So this is a great day and a great project in our downtown and we're hoping the community will come out and celebrate."
- c. Halloween Activities. Ms. Trout, "The line-up will begin at 5:15 p.m. on Saturday, October 31, 2015, for the Halloween Parade which is at Lynch Field, and then Trick-or-Treating in the City will commence from 6:00-8:00 p.m. actually on October 31<sup>st</sup>, on Halloween."
- d. The 24<sup>th</sup> Annual Holiday Parade. Ms. Trout, "So mark your calendars now. The parade will begin at the top of North Main Street at noon, Saturday, November 21, 2015. And you want to come out and see it. You don't want to miss the floats, the choruses, the bands, and, most importantly, Santa and Mrs. Claus."

### \*\*\*INTRODUCTION OF BILL\*\*\*

Bill No. 13 – AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GREENSBURG, COUNTY OF WESTMORELAND, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING §249-62 OF CHAPTER 249 ENTITLED 'VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC' OF ORDINANCE NO. 1647 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF GREENSBURG. Ms. Trout, "Introduction of the Bill is prompted by a receipt of a petition submitted by the majority of residents from North Carpenter Avenue requesting the one-way street be changed to two-way. Enactment of the Bill as an Ordinance removes the portion of North Carpenter Avenue that runs from an unnamed alley to West Otterman Street from Schedule VI that lists designated one-way streets which is under §249-62 of the Code. And, again, this is being introduced tonight."

### \*\*\*COUNCIL APPROVAL\*\*\*

- a. Hiring of Seasonal Employee in the Recreation Department. Ms. Trout, "Council approval accepts a recommendation from the Rink Manager to hire Anna Hu as a Skating Instructor at a rate of \$10 per hour."

  Councilman Eger MOVED to approve the hiring, and Councilman Vesely SECONDED. No discussion. All voted unanimously to approve the hiring.
- b. Recommendations by the Historic and Architectural Review Board (HARB) for Issuance/Non-Issuance of Certificates of Appropriateness. Ms. Trout, "Tonight's HARB slate includes recommendations for approval of two projects located in the Gateway District. Hannah Moros is the applicant for Makar Properties, LLC for a demolition project on their property at 637 West Pittsburgh Street; and Alexis Bevan from Beans & Baguettes is the applicant for a projecting and freestanding signage project on property owned by Jawdat Nikoula at 250 West Otterman Street. Also, for your consideration is a second demolition project at 320 South Maple Avenue owned by the Penn West Conference. Pastor Craft of the First Reformed United Church of Christ is the applicant for this project that is located in the Downtown District. The HARB is recommending Council not approve issuance of a Certificate of Appropriateness for this demolition project. A vote for approval by Council would accept the slate of recommendations as put forward by the HARB. So two for and one against would be your vote."

Councilman Vesely MOVED to approve the slate of projects recommended for the issuance/non-issuance of Certificates of Appropriateness as presented, and Councilman Finfrock SECONDED. No discussion. All voted unanimously to approve.

c. Purchase of Seagrave Pumper Fire Truck for Greensburg Volunteer Fire Department Hose Company No. 7. Ms. Trout, "Council approval accepts the bid through Emergency Equipment Sales, LLC from Seagrave Fire Apparatus, LLC through COSTARS Contract 013-140 in the amount of \$559,989. The truck should be ready for delivery within 280 calendar days, and payment terms are payment in full upon delivery and acceptance of the vehicle."

Mayor Silvis, "And if we don't accept this tonight the price goes up to over \$600,000." Ms. Trout, "Possibly."

Councilman Finfrock MOVED to approve the purchase, and Councilman Eger SECONDED. No further discussion. All voted unanimously to approve.

\*\*\*ADJOURNMENT\*\*\*Mayor Silvis MOVED to adjourn the meeting.

# **DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS**

## REPORT FOR COUNCIL MEETING - 10/12/15

- We were notified that DEP will conduct the annual inspection of the Jack's Run and Mt. Pleasant Street flood projects on November 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>.
- 2) Last week Street Department employees were assigned to perform maintenance on the flood projects. This included removal of unwanted vegetation that was penetrating the fence, repairing loose fence posts, painting and lubricating the numerous flap gates, and removal of a large tree that had fallen in the upper most portion of the Jack's Run channel.
- 3) All of the bridges have been sealed prior to the arrival of winter. This work included sealing the concrete bridge decks, sidewalks, curbs, and parapet walls.
- 4) Neighborhood leaf collection will begin tomorrow. For the next few months all of our resources will be dedicated to this task. Home owners are reminded to place loose leaves in windrows along the street so that the vacuum machines can access them. A detailed weekly collection schedule can be viewed on the city's website. This service will terminate the first week in December, or should a significate snow storm occur before then.
- An order of 250 tons of rock salt was recently received. This was done so that the salt storage building could be filled prior to the beginning of the winter season, and to purchase the material at current cost before the price increase occurs November 1<sup>st</sup>.

From July 31, 2014 to August 1, 2015 twenty two (22) commercial properties have been sold to new owners with the total value of downtown property transfers totaling \$4,626,442.00. The average increase in value is 74%. Some examples of transferred property include the following locations;

- 1. 126 W. Pittsburgh Street sold for \$311,000.00
- 2. 238 South Pennsylvania Avenue sold for \$600,000.00
- 3. 248 West Otterman Street sold for \$345,000.00
- 4. 117 North Main Street sold for \$270,000.00

This is good news for property owners of our downtown properties.
