AN ORDINANCE

TO AMEND CHAPTER 151, KNOWN AS "FEES", OF ORDINANCE NO. 1646. CHANGING, DELETING AND/OR ADDING CERTAIN FEES AND/OR LANGUAGE FOR CITY SERVICES IN VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Greensburg to amend Chapter 151 of Ordinance No. 1646 as follows:

A. Compliance bonds shall become the property of the City of Greensburg if one or more of the following occur during the building permit process:

- (1) The applicant fails to contact the City of Greensburg within six months regarding a final inspection and/or certificate of occupancy and/or status of the construction project. The building permit will be considered null and void in one year from the date of issuance, and therefore, the compliance bond will become the property of the City.
- (2) Occupancy or use before final inspectian and issuance of applicable certifications.
- (3) Failure to complete landscaping requirements within a six-month period from the date of issuance of the permit.
- (4) Failure in complete the project as per the plans submitted with the building permit application.
