AN ORDINANCE

TO AMEND CHAPTER 151, KNOWN AS 'FEES', OF ORDINANCE NO. 1646, CHANGING, DELETING, AND/OR ADDING CERTAIN FEES AND/OR LANGUAGE FOR CITY SERVICES IN VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Greensburg to amend Chapter 151 of Ordinance No. 1646 as follows:

Excepted from this definition are those selling goods for charitable purposes and selling food items that they have farmed or otherwise created.

Impounded Vehicles**

§ 151-2 Daily fee.

The storage and impounding of any vehicle, as authorized by the Chief of Police, on City property will incur a fee of \$10 per day against the owner or owners of said vehicle for each day that the vehicle remains on City property. This fee will be additional to any fees charged by the approved hauler of the impounded vehicle.

§ 151-12 Opening fee.

The fee for a street opening shall be \$500.

Article X Volunteer Fire Department

[Adopted 5-11-2020 by Ord. No. 2108]

§ 151-13 Findings and intent.

- A. Findings. The City of Greensburg recognizes that the duties of the Greensburg Volunteer Fire Department require the use of emergency rescue and response materials, hazardous abatement materials and fire-suppression tools, materials and equipment during its emergency responses. The City of Greensburg also recognizes that the costs of damaged or expended materials places an increasing financial burden on the Volunteer Fire Department.
- B. Intent. This article is intended to confirm and/or grant the Volunteer Fire Department the authority to seek recovery of all reasonable costs of responding to such emergency incidents, as allowed by applicable law.

Section 3 Authorization to recover costs.

The Greensburg Volunteer Fire Department is authorized to recover costs from property owners and/or insurance carriers for the usual, reasonable, and customary costs of abatement, construction, stabilization and any other materials used, consumed and /or expended in response to any fire, safety, rescue, hazardous waste or emergency incident.

§ 151-15 Emergency services not to be refused for lack of insurance or ability to pay.

Nothing in this article shall authorize the Volunteer Fire Department or Department personnel to refuse or delay any rescue service to any person, firm, organization or corporation, due to the lack of insurance

coverage or inability or refusal to pay for said rescue services.

§ 151-16 **Severability**

If any part of this article is declared to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the validity of the remaining provisions shall be unaffected thereby. It is the intention of the Council of the City of Greensburg that this article would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid part not been included.

§ 151-17 **Repealer**

All ordinances inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.
